Laws of the United States.

An act making Appropriations for the support of
Government for the year one thousand eight
hundred and twenty-eight.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House
of Representatives of the United States of
America in Congress assembled, That
the following sums be, and the same are
hereby respectively appropriated, for
the service of the year one thousand
eight hundred and twenty eight; that
is to say:

For compensation to the President of
the United States, twenty-five thousand
dollars.

For compensation to the Vice-Presi-
dent of the United States, five thousand
dollars.

For compensation to the Secretary of
State, six thousand dollars.

For compensation to the Clerks in
the Department of State, per act of
twentieth April, one thousand eight
hundred and eighteen, fifteen thousand nine
hundred dollars.

For compensation to one Machinist,
in the Patent Office, per act of twenty-
sixth of May, one thousand eight hun-
dred and twenty-four, seven hundred
dollars.

For compensation to the Messengers
in the Department of State, including
the Messenger in the Patent Office, in
full of all allowances, one thousand four
hundred and fifty dollars.

For compensation to Clerks in said
Department, by virtue of the act of sec-
ond March, one thousand eight hun-
dred and twenty-seven, four thousand
four hundred dollars.

For the incidental and contingent ex-
penses of the Department of State, in-
cluding the expenses of printing and
distributing the laws, and for extra

For compensation to the officers and
clerk of the Mint, nine thousand six
hundred dollars.

For compensation to the persons em-
ployed in the different operations of the

For incidental and contingent expens-
es and repairs; cost of machinery; for
allowance of wastage in gold and
silver coinage of the Mint; and for the
occasional employment of an assistant
engraver; the unexpended balance here-
tofore appropriated to these objects, a-
mounting to twelve thousand seven hun-
dred and eighty-two dollars thirty-five
cents.

ernments, two thousand and fifty dol-
lars.

For the support and maintenance of
light houses, floating lights, beacons,
buoys, and stakeages, including the
purchase of oil, keeper's salaries, re-
pairs and improvements, contingent ex-
penses, one hundred & sixty-six thousand
four hundred and forty-four dollars.

For completing a light house on Ba-
ker's Island, near Mount Desert, in
Maine; being the amount of an approp-
riation for that object, carried to the
surplus fund on the thirty-first day of
December last, one thousand three hun-
dred dollars.

For placing six buoys in the Vine-
yard Sound, in addition to the approp-
riation already made, fifty dollars.

For building a light House on Cove
Point, instead of Cedar Point as here-
tofore ordered, in Maryland, being the
amount of an appropriation for that ob-
ject, carried to the surplus fund, on the
thirty-first day of December last, five
thousand six hundred and eighty-five
dollars.

For the erection of two light houses
on Cape Elizabeth in Maine, in addi-
tion to the appropriation of three thou-
sand dollars made by act of second of
March, one thousand eight hundred and
twenty-seven, four thousand five hun-
dred dollars.

For placing three buoys on the bar
at the entrance of St. Augustine Har-
bor, in Florida, in addition to the ap-
propriation of one hundred and twenty
dollars, made by act of second of March,
one thousand eight hundred and twen-
ty-seven, two hundred and eighty dol-
lars.

For placing three buoys in St. Marks
Harbor, in Florida, in addition to the
appropriation of one hundred and twen-
ty dollars, made by act of second of
March, one thousand eight hundred and
twenty-seven, two hundred and eighty
dollars.
