The improvement, which makes these Machines superior to any now in use in the Southern and even Northern country, is because of the body of the cylinder being cast in one or two pieces, with the heads of teeth or points all cast together, being a solid mass—thereby giving it additional weight, and obviating the danger of the spikes flying out, as sometimes happens with the wooden cylinder, which greatly endangers the lives of the operatives.
