No publie instruction is given in the local or peculiar jurisprudence of any particular State; but the Library, consisting of nearly 8000 volumes, furnishes ample means for the study of local law and practice, and the students are privately assisted in these studies, by the Professors, as occasion may require. The active la-bors of instruction are shared equally between Mr. Justice STORY and Professor GREENLEAN, who has the immediate superintendence of the Law School.
