FANNING'S MARE.

The exploits of Fanning, the famous Partisan of Randolph, would make a body of facts more interesting than any tale of fiction. He was a reckless fellow—bloody-minded as the hounds of Hayti. He sometimes slew the innocent and the helpless in cold blood—the coward!

But he had that instinctive love and bearing of authority that kept his people within the metes and bounds of his own despotic will. He and his party were one day resting themselves by a spring; Fanning rode into Salisbury, had the bugle extracted from his shoulder, and after lingering some time with the effects of his wound and exertion, finally got well. And that gallant mare, that had done him such good service, he kept and cherished till she died of old age.
