A Judge, on the north-west circuit of Ireland, tried a cause, in which much of the local consequence of a gentleman in the neighborhood was implicated. It was a landlord's prosecution against one of his tenants, for assault and battery, committed on the person of the prosecutor by the defendant, in rescuing his only child, an innocent and beautiful girl, from personal violation. When the defendant was bro't into Court, the prosecutor also appeared. and swore to every fact in the indictment. The poor defendant had no lawyer to tell his story—he, however, pleaded his own cause effectually, appealing to the judgment and the heart. The Jury found him not guilty.

The Judge was enraged, and told the lary they must go back and re-consider their giving such an infamous verdict. The Jury bowed, went back, in a quarter of an hour returned, when the foreman, a venerable old man, thus addressed the Bench: " My Lord, in compliance with your desire, we went back to our room: but as we found then no reason to alter our opinions on our verdict, we return it to you, in the same words as before-not guilty. We heard your Lordship's reproof; but we do not accept it as properly applying to us.
