WINTER ARRANGEMENT.
VIA Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail Road and Chesapeake Bay Line Steamers.

On and after the 15th instant, the Boats on the Chesapeake Bay will run only three times a week.

The Steamer Georgia, Capt. Coffey, having undergone extensive repairs for the Winter service, will leave Portsmouth for Baltimore on Tuesdays, Thursdays and Saturdays, immediately on the arrival of the Cars from Weldon. By this route, Passengers may rely on a certainty of reaching Baltimore.

The Bay Company has engaged the services of the Ice Boat, whenever the Ice is so bad as to prevent the Georgia's reaching Baltimore: should the Ice Boat be unable to get through, the Passengers will be landed at Annapolis from whence they may proceed (by Rail Road) either to Baltimore or Washington City.

Passengers wishing to take this popular route, leaving Raleigh on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays, and taking the Stage at sledge's will proceed direct on.

The Daily Line will be resumed early in the Season, of which due notice will be given.
