NOTICE to TRAVELLERS GOING NORTH.

VIA Portsmouth and Roanoke Rail-
road and Chesapeake Bay Line
Steamers.

ON and after the 16th instant, the Boats on the
Chesapeake Bay will run only three times a
week.

The Steamer Georgia, Capt. Coffe, having under-
gone extensive repairs for the Winter service, will
leave Portsmouth for Baltimore on Tuesdays, Thurs-
days and Saturdays, immediately on the arrival of
the Cars from Weldon. By this route, Passengers
may rely on a certainty of reaching Baltimore.

The Bay Company have engaged the services of
the Ice Boat, whenever the ice is so bad as to prevent
the Georgia's reaching Baltimore—should the Ice
Boat be unable to get through, the Passengers will
be landed in Annapolis from whence they may pro-
ceed (by Rail Road) either to Baltimore or Wash-
ington City.

Passengers wishing to take this popular route,
leaving Raleigh on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fri-
days, and taking the Stage at Edgefield will proceed
direct on.

son, of which no notice will be given.
