WINTER ARRANGEMENT.
1/2 Portsmouth and Roanoke Point Road and Chesapeake Bay Line Steamers.

On and after the 16th instant, the Boats on the Chesapeake Bay will run only three times a week.

The Steamer Georgia, Capt. Coffey, having undergone extensive repairs for the Winter service, will leave Portsmouth for Baltimore on Thursday evenings and Saturdays, immediately on the arrival of the Cars from Weymouth. By this route Passengers may rely on a certainty of reaching Baltimore.

The Bay Company have engaged the services of the ice Boat, whenever the ice is so bad as to prevent the Georgia's reaching Baltimore—should the ice be too late to get through, no passengers will be landed at Annapolis from whence they may proceed by Rail Road either to Baltimore or Washington City.

Passengers wishing to take this popular route, leaving Raleigh on Monday, Wednesdays, and Fridays, and taking the Stage at Sludgey, will proceed direct.

The Daily Line will be resumed early in the season, of which due notice will be given.
