

Washington Depots, Workshops and Tools, Warehouses, Water Stations, Engines, Cars, &c. &c. Also, the stock of Iron, Lumber, and Fire Wood, which may then be on hand, and all other articles, owned and used by said Company for keeping up said Rail Road, and transportation on the same.
