Last night the playhouse in this city was crouded with an unusal audience. There could not have been less than six hundred persons in the house. Just before the conclusion of the play, the scenery caught fre, and in a few minutes the whole building was wrapt in flames. It is already ascertained that 61 persons were devoured by that most terrific element. The editor of this paper was in the house when the ever to be remembered, deplorable accident occurred. He is informed that the scenes took fire in the back part of thehouse, by the raising of a chandelier: that the boy. who was ordered by some of the players to raise it, stated that if he did so, the scenery would take fire, when he was commanded, in a peremptory manner, to hoist it. The boy beved, and the fire was instantly communicated to the scenery. He gave the alarm in the rear of the stage, and requested some of the attendants to cut the cords by which these combustible materials were suspended. The person whose dutwit was to perform this business, became paniestruck, and sought his own safety. This unfortunately happened at a time when one of the performers was playing near the orchestra, and the greatest part of the stage, with its horrid danger, was obscured from the audience by a curtain. The flames spread with almost the rapidity of lightning, and the fire falling from the cieling upon the performer, was the first notice which the people had of their danger. Even then, many supposed it to be a part of the play, and were for a little while restrained from flight by a cry from the stage that there was no danger. Men, women and children were pressing upon each other, while the firmes were seizing upon those behind. The editor went to the different windows, which were not very high, and implored his fellow creatures to save their lives by jumping out of them. Those nearest to the windows, ignorant of their great danger, were afraid to leap down, while those behind them were seen catching on fire, and writhing in the greatest agonies of pain and distress. At length those behind, urged by the pressing flames, pushed those out wio were nearest to the windows, and one upon another, some with their clothes a few days for payment. on fire; some half roasted; Oh wretch. ed me!
