Interesting Views of Our
Country. Country.
W ashington, July 21.
Translated Copy of a letter from a distinguished and entightened
French Emigrant, to his friend here.

Dated from the Arkansas
Post, the 25th March, 1817 . My Dear Fiizmd-Of all he privations I have endured dur git the last five months, that of re naining withour letters from you the most sensibly affects me. fi vould be too formidable a task to attempt to give you extracts from ny notes on the Ohio, the Mis issippi, the river Volt, the St. rancis, and the White River, hich afford no position suitable or a large setlement ; but fron
what I have myself od from every information which receive, I feel assured that 2 hall find on the borders of thi igher, all that we can desire. The Arkansas, the more picturesquc and tertile is the country, partic alarly that part of it lying on the ight bank, which belongs to the Indians, who feel the greatest the strongest desire that they would form a settlement near them; styling them their Great
Fathers, $Q$ characterizing them by Fathers, \& characterizing them by the remark, that they are as goo
as Indians. It is confidently assert as Indians. It is confidently assert
ed that government is at this mo ed that government is at this mo
ment negociating the purchase of ment negociating the purchase o
a considerable portion of this im mense territory, which has ooly two or three hundred families for
sovereigns, legitimate proprictors overeigns, legitimate propritors
o a country extending three hun dred miles in length, and two hupdred in breadth If this purchase should be made, it might be practicable, after having ob
tained the left bank, to induce a cession of the right also, which have been obliged to remain at the post of the Arkanasa, on account
of the rising of the riter and the difficulty of procuring a light boa to ascend it ; but this week's delay has not been lost. I have visited a great proportion of th lands situated between White Riv er, the St. Francis, and the Ar ransas, and have seen immens prairies. The largest is nearl oe hundred miles in circumfer The smaller, which is The smaller, which is a Spanish be extremely desirabie for any one who could stock it with two thousand head of cattle, but would not be suitable for a colony. Aearly all the inhabitants of th are French? many of them very amiable and sociable. All unite in wish ing for us as neighbors, unless it be a few who live by hunt ing and trading ; but the greater
part have given up this mode o life for the cultivation of the land More than one hundred families have within very few years, established the mselves here, as squaters at one hurdred \& fify to two hupdred, and even three hun
dred miles from this post, on the beautitul beautiful banks of the Arkansas,

I eannot enumerate all the varieties of the vine, among wbich are the pente grape, which the Indians call Focco ; the mountain grape ripe in June, the red, the
white, the black, the violet, \&c. This, the hack, the violet, ac his, my dear air, is the kast \& atural nursery of Bacchus.
I have devised a very simple andeconomical mode of sperediy obtaining good grapes froten the wild vines. It is to cut down an djacent tree, on which I incline the vine, taking care not to ipjure its stem, removing all unnecessary chage from around it, to free it rom ohade, and pruning it on the propt for it, There are large propt for it There are large
districts in which almost every tree supports two or three enormous vines. Your northern country is the Arabia Petrea of A. merica; and your vegetation stunted when compared with this.
