N Office of Inspection will be open in 1 each county of the district of North-Carolina during the whole of the month of lune, where owners or possessor stills are required to make their entires, and elections. the laws demand high fines and penalties for retufal or neglect of entry of itills, and for distilling without first making an election; and intractors of every defeription may reit affored of having the laws executed in their fulleit latitude. It is further notified to such diffillers who intend o pay the duty on the quantity of spirits distilled, that they must politiv ly make fuch election at the time of entry in the month of June, otherwise they will be chargeable with the yearly duty the rate of 54 cents for every gallon of the capacity of their fells. The fame is applicable to those who intend to vork their itills by the month. t is contrary to law, to grant a licence for any fractional part of a month: diffillers will take notice thereof and regulate their elections actordingly, as the collecting officers have received instructions on that head, WILL.
