

7. Making a partial appropriation for the literary establishment for the year 1796.

8. For the relief of Jose Roiz Silva.

9. For the relief of certain officers and soldiers, who have been wounded or disabled, in the actual service of the United States.

10. To continue in force an act "to ascertain the fees in admiralty proceedings in the district courts of the United States, and for other purposes."

11. Making certain provisions in regard to the circuit court for the district of North-Carolina.

12. Authorizing the erection of a light-house on Baker's island, in the state of Massachusetts.

13. For establishing trading houses with the Indian tribes.

14. A resolve, directing further returns in the cases of claimants for invalid pensions.

15. Supplementary to an act, entitled, "An act to provide a naval armament."

16. Authorizing and directing the Secretary of War to place certain persons, therein named, on the pension list.

17. In addition to an act, intitled "An act making further provision for the support of public credit and for the redemption of the public debt."

18. Making further provision relative to seven cutters.

19. To continue in force, for a limited time, an act, intitled "An act declaring the consent of Congress to an act of the state of Maryland, passed the 28th day of December, 1793, for the appointment of a health officer."

20. Authorizing a loan for the use of the City of Washington, in the district of Columbia, and for other purposes therein mentioned.

21. Making appropriations for defraying the expenses which may arise in carrying into effect a treaty made between the United States and certain Indian tribes north west of the river Ohio.

22. Making an appropriation for defraying the expenses which may arise in carrying into effect the treaty made between the United States and the Dey and Regency of Algiers.

23. Making an appropriation towards defraying the expenses which may arise in carrying into effect the treaty of amity, commerce and navigation, made between the United States and Great-Britain.

24. Making appropriations for defraying the expenses which may arise in carrying into effect the treaty made between the United States and the king of Spain.

25. Declaring the consent of Congress to a certain act of the state of Maryland; and to continue an act declaring the assent of Congress to certain acts of the states of Maryland, Georgia, and Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations, so far as the same respects the states of Georgia and Rhode-Island and Providence Plantations.

26. Allowing compensation for horses killed in battle, belonging to officers of the army of the United States.

27. To repeal so much of an act, intitled "An act to establish the judicial courts of the United States," as directs that alternate sessions of the circuit court for the district of Pennsylvania shall be holden at York-town; and for other purposes.

28. Providing for the sale of the lands of the United States, in the territory north-west of the river Ohio and above the mouth of Kentucky river.

29. Authorizing the erection of a light-house on Cape-Cod, in the state of Massachusetts.

30. Authorizing Ebenezer Zane to locate certain lands in the territory of the United States north-west of the river Ohio.

31. To regulate trade and intercourse with the Indian tribes; and to preserve peace on the frontiers.

32. Altering the compensation of the Accountant of the War Department.

33. Laying duties on carriages for the conveyance of persons; and repealing the former act for that purpose.

34. In addition to an act, intitled "An act supplementary to an act, intitled "An

act to provide more effectually for the collection of the duties on goods, wares and merchandize imported into the United States, and on the tonnage of ships and vessels."

35. For the relief and protection of American seamen.

36. Respecting the mint.

37. To alter the sessions of the circuit courts in the district of Vermont and Rhode-Island; and for other purposes.

38. Relative to quarantine.

39. For the relief of persons imprisoned for debt.

40. Making further provision for the expenses attending the intercourse of the United States with foreign nations; and to continue in force the act, intitled "An act providing the means of intercourse between the United States and foreign nations."

41. For the relief of Sylvanus Bourne.

42. To continue in force, for a limited time, the acts therein mentioned.

43. To ascertain and fix the military establishment of the United States.

44. To regulate the compensation of clerks.

45. Making provision for the payment of certain debts of the United States.

46. Providing passports for the ships and vessels of the United States.

47. To suspend, in part, the act, intitled "An act to alter and amend the act, intitled an act laying certain duties upon snuff and refined sugar."

48. Making an appropriation to satisfy certain demands attending the late insurrection, and to increase the compensation to jurors and witnesses in the courts of the United States.
