possible, the Sum of Twenty Pounds, Proclamation Money, to be collected by the respective Delegates of each County, in Manner as shall appear to them most convenient, and pay the same in to the Hands of Richard Caswell, Esq; to be by him equally divided among the Delegates appointed to attend the General Congress at Philadelphia, as a Recompence for their Trouble and Expence in attending the said Congress.

Mr. Thomas Macknight, a Delegate for the County of Currituck, having been called upon to sign (with the other Members of this Convention) the Association approved of by the Continental Congress held at Philadelphia, thereupon refused, and withdrew himself.

Resolved, That in the Opinion of this Convention, that from the disingenuous and equivocal Behaviour of the said Thomas Macknight, it is manifest his Intentions are inimical to the Cause of American Liberty, and we do hold him up as a proper Object of Contempt to this Continent, and recommend that every Person break off all Connection, and have no future commercial Intercourse or Dealing with him.

Resolved, That the above Resolve be published in the Gazettes of this and the neighbouring
