In confequence of thefe orders, the militia from the neigh bouring counties have already repaired po their appointed rencez vous with the utnoft alacrity, and feem determined to lend their affiftance to theic country on this extraordinary oceafion with a cheerfulnefs that will ever do honour to them. An inttance of the extracrdinary readinefs of thefe brave friends tu Jiberty to enter the field may be produced in the Suff:x militia, who, being wamed cot on Saturday, encamped on Sunday evening on the banks of James river forty miles from home. So rapid a march is fearcely to be paralielled.

In purfuance of the powers.granted by ACt of Affembly, his Excellency the Governor, immediately on his return to Wiliamfbutg, with the advice of the Council, appointed Thomas Nelson, jun. efq; county lieuterant of York, brigadier general and commander in chief of the forces in this cominonweal:h. The appoinement of a gentleman fo univerfally beloved and efteemed for his zealous attachment to cur facrid caufe, cannot fail of giving the mrit unftigned pleafure to every friend to his country, who reflecte, that, except our neble general in the north, here is cot a eative of America to wh.fe ftardard fo great a numbef of warm friends and refpectable perfons would repair as to that truly noble and worthy gentleman's.
We are alf, informied, from utioubted authority, that the worthy general has accepted the command upon the moft difintere Red fnotives, as he has refufed a falary, his table only being fupported at the expence of the commonweath. Such inttances of genuine patriotifin mark the moft genercus attachment to his country, and its liberties.
Yofterday evening thie tropps in this city, both regulats and militia, were reviewed on the College green by genera! Nelfon, who expreffed himfelf mach fatisfied wi;h their readinefs to at, tend on the prefent occafion, and made a mott animatcing fipeech to them on the prefent profpect before us.

NEWBER N, September 5, 1777.
Since our laft arrived here Capt. Demifon, in the Sloop Heart of Oak; from Surinam. The Captain reports, that in Lat. 34. Lon. 73. he fell in with an Englifh Fleet of 63 fail, confilting of Ships, Brigs, Sloops and Schooners, amo g them 7 or 8 Flags; they, were fteering to the, Eaftward. The Captain fays he was attacked by one of the Fleet, a fmall Tender, but had the good Fortune to efcape.
Juft now arrived a. Veffel here from the Bar, fhe was outward bound, and juft after getting out, was chafed by an Englifi Brig, called the Lord Howe, and obliged to put back, and that the Brig now lies off the Bar. We hear oyr Provincial Veffel the Pennfylvania Farmer, ftill lies at Core Sound, but in no Condition to make any Defence.
