Whether their manœuvres will be confined to Germany alone, Poland in particular, or whether it will affect any o:her part of Europe, time only can determine. The Pruffian troops are kept in as perfect order, and good difcipline, as if a war was on the point of initantly breaking out. This, however, does not appear to be the cale at prefent, unjefs between Ruffia and the Porte, and the winter feafon will keep them quiet at lealt for fome months. The Pruflian court is much crowded with military people, feveral Americans, and ${ }_{2}$ few Englifh: Lord L-_n, in his continental tou, has been bosh a: Berlin and Potfdam, but his bon vivaist is not generally relifhed."

0NEW BER N, Deceinber 26. N Wedne!day laft the General Affembly of this State, finithed the Bufinefs of the Seffion, having paffed 48 Bills, many of them of great Confequence, particularly a Bill for eftablifhing Courts of Law, and a Bill for opening the Land Office, and granting the vacant Lands in this State. Lett the hope of efcaping punifmen: by remaining undifcovered, fhould tempt any to reject the terms now held out to them, they may be affured, that the moft effectual meafures will be purfued, in every State, for apprehending, and bringing them to a fpeedy trial.
