what woold be the effect of that independericy? 1 cannot dee into futurity; but it is big with many poffible evils. -Independency, with a cordial tove between us, is one thing; with an yuiton with oar enemies fatal. From their independency a danger arifes from a great naval power; a danger alfo to our other poffeffions. I do not think that we fhould yield to it, till our refources are much lowered. Independency is not beneficial to America. She cannot be fo happy, fo eafy, cannot have fuch perfonal liberty, as if the remains dependent on us. -If independent, fhe muft be loaded with heavy burthens, more heavy tian the had; her perfonal liberty will not be fo great. Her prefent fituation, as compared with ours, is ten times more grievous. Her farmers are ruined; when all the neceffaries of life fell at prices the molt high, they are compelled to fell the produce of their land at a fmall price in comparifon. I was affured that at Albany, tea, a neceflary article there, foted a 16 dollars per pound; at falt at 30 dollars per bufhel. 'Thisking that men in this fitoation will be inclined to peace apen joft and reafonable terms, I move the houfe for leave to bring in two bills, \&ic. Etc.
Draughts of the two bills were accorcingly brought in by his lordihip, which will be inferted in our next, tuggetier with the refoiutions of Congrefs on the matter: The honourable board have ta ken up, and fully entered into the fipirit and intentions of this infidious plan, again circulated by the emitauies of that hatughty and imperious court, with a view, if poliblie to delude us ial a faial lekurity, and remiffion of our ftrenuous efforts, in our juitifisbie defence; aud have chercupon unanimoully refolved, that the united ftates cannot hold any conference or treaty with any cofnmifioners on the part of Great-Britain, unlef's they fhait, as the finit preiminaiy, withdraw their fleets and armies, or cile, in potitive and expreis termz, acknowledge the independence of the hiid ftates. To which, may all the friends of American liberty fyy, amen, amen
