These are therefore to command the said slave forthwith to furrender himself, and return home to his said Master. we do also require the sheriff of the faid County to make diligent search and pursuit after the said slave, and him having found, to apprehend and secure, so that he may be conveyed to his faid Malter, or otherwise discharged as the law directs, And the faid theriff is hereby empowered to raife and take with him such power of his County as he shall think fit, for apprehending the faid flave. And we do hereby, by virtue of an act of affembly of this state concerning fervants and flaves, intimate and declare, if the faid flave doth not furrender himself, and return home, immediately after the publication of these prefents, that then any person may kill or destroy the said slave, by fuch means as he or they may think fit, without acculation or impeachment of any crime or offence for fo doing, or without incurring any penalty or forfeiture thereby.
