they remained from 12 o'clock at mid day until 12 at night.

At about half-pall 12 at night, entered the Stadtbould, and forcibly liberated three or lour of their party who had been confined for murder ; who were next day feen to parade the freets of the city fem for to keep the peace of the city.

By the Friends we have received Dutch papers in May, from which we that caute to be tranfitted what may appear deferving of notice.

Letters by the Three r riends mention a report having circulated in Amsterdam of an engagement on the Rhine, in which the Auffrians were deteated with confiderable lots.

London accounts of the 14th May flate, the reports of a trefh infurrection of the Poles, on the confines of Turkey, under the command of the Chiefs DEUISKO, KOLLYSKO and LIBERADWYZKY : that they had published a manifetto, in which they declare their reliance on the affiftance of the Porte to deliver their country from oppreflion.

Should this prove true the meditated rupture between Ruffia and Turkey will probably be brought to an immediate iffue.

Yellerday at noon we had the Proclamation as follows :- The Commonalty of Amfterdam, with that fenfibility with which they always have infpired their fellow citizens, having been informed, that a great many of the inhabitants of this city, the greatest part of them belonging to the militia which torms the artillery, have been to audacious, feveral days paft as to make feveral attempts to fabdue the defenceleis citizens without the walls of the city, their intention being to diffurb and abule the citi-zens, by which their perfons and property would have been brought into imminent danger.

Therefore the magistrates after mature deliberation have found it neceffary, to difmits the militia artillery, and all the citizens who have neglected to perform their dury ; difmitting likewife, the colonels, captains, lieutenants and all the iubaltern officers of the rioters.

The magiftrates ordered them to bring their arms before the committee, at 6 o'clock P. M. of the fame day, at a place by them appointed, that they might be deposited in the military flores. The magiltrates alto expretsly forbid the officers of all ranks to wear any fide arms or other defensive weapons whatloever, under penalty of the leverelt punifhment However, thele orders of the magiltrates have not been regarded by the five companies of the artillery, confifting of five hundred men, one third of which only returned arms. A body of them alfembled yefterday afternoon in the fields, from whence they marched to town, with drawn fwords, being joined by a great number of citizens & polled themieives opposite the City-Hall, in spite of a very powerful guard, which was reinforced by the cavalry. At half paft 6 o'clock they fent a meffage to the alembled magistrates, the refult of which is as yet unknown. In the mean time the mob re-paired to the prifon, and by force liberated all the prifoners, and committed many other outrages; but there was no blood fhed.
