NEWSPAPERS.

N the late report of the felect committee of I the House of Representatives on the Post-Office Law, the tubject of news papers is introduced, and fome causes are therein affigned for the failures in transmitting them to subscribers. It is not recollected, however, that the fource of the difficulties was noticed, and that is a due responsibility on the part of the postoffice. It is not pretended that news papers are conveyed under the fame fanction as letters. Until this responsibility is created it is in vain to expect that the buliness will be either regularly or punctually performed.

A plan was suggested, we believe, by the late Post Master General, which if adopted will remove every deficulty. It was fomething like this. That all subscriptions for newspapers to be transmitted by the mail, should be received at the respective Port Offices. That the Deputy. Poft Mafters fhould be responfible for the tubicription money—that the printers thould make a certain discount from the fubcriptions in favour of the Deputy Poft-Mafters, or the person specially trusted with the bufinets under him.

The details of this plan would require an additional clerk in the office at the feat of government. 'An arrangement of this kind in the Post Office in Great Britain took place but a few years fince ; and by late accounts it appears that the circulation of newspapers in that kingdom has encreased from Two to upwards of Twelve Millions annually in confequence of it.

The advantages of this plan are obvious, but too numerous to be specified-all impositions may be avoided, and the papers feat in the most favourable condition.
