Case of the Steamer Lillian—A Spanish War Vessel Pursuit.

As will be recollected by our readers, orders were received here on Monday from the State Department directing Lieutenant Bond, of the revenue cutter Delaware, to repair to Cedar Keys and, if possible, to intercept the steamer Lillian, supposed to be a Cuban privateer. As the Delaware was on the marine way, opposite the city, undergoing repairs, the officer in command was obliged to charter the steamer Lone Star for the chase.

The Lone Star left this port on Monday morning at daylight, with the officers and crew of the Delaware. Whether she had any armament or not, besides small arms, we are not informed. She proceeded to Cedar Keys, and when she arrived there the bird had flown five hours previous. The Lone Star followed in chase until night, when she gave it up and returned to Cedar Keys, taking possession of a small lot of fixed ammunition, knapsacks, caudens, etc., which were left by the Lillian for want of time.

The Lone Star reports that when the chase was given up that they saw a three-masted stack steamer in the chase, which was supposed to be the Spanish steamer Clurruco. The Lillian was in command of Captain Harris, who is an old Confederate blockade runner. She is Clyde built, and is a vessel of 1,000 tons, though formerly only 600. She has lately been repaired and enlarged.

We are informed on good authority that there were about 500 troops, 22 field pieces, a large quantity of small arms, fixed ammunition, commissary and quarter-master's stores on board.

The troops were under command of Generals Cuero and Williams, the latter being an old Confederate officer, having served during a portion of the war as a Colonel of artillery in Mobile.

The men were principally from New York, and composed of what is known as roughs. Mobile Tribune, Oct. 9.

A Strange Story from Jerusalem.

Our friends of the Hebrew faith will doubtless feel much interested in knowing of certain strange developments which, according to the Austrian newspapers, have manifested themselves in Jerusalem. These developments refer to the coming this year of the Jewish Messiah. The story, as told, is certainly singular enough. It appears that the Rabbi of Parks, a town in Hungary, has received letters from Jerusalem which state that toward the end of last month a column of fire was seen near the ruins of Solomon's Temple, and that a strong voice was heard which addressed itself to an Israeliite who was worshipping there at the time. This voice warned the devotee of the coming, this year, of the Messiah, and declared that the Israelites should repent, and be more observant of the religion of their fathers. The man so addressed then went to the city near Jerusalem, and people treated him as an impostor, and some went even so far as to seek to take his life; but he, as miraculously endowed with more than human strength, fought hundreds of his assailants, and when, afterward, a battalion of soldiers was sent to arrest him, baffled them in their efforts to capture him. Two Israeliites, the Hungarian journals say, have been dispatched to Jerusalem to learn the exact facts of this extraordinary affair. It is clear that, if not one of the race of prophets, the man, who, as above narrated, opposed this host of enemies must be an athlete of no small pretensions.
