CITY ITEMS.

The Wilmington S. F. E. will celebrate their anniversary to-day.

The body of an unknown man was found at Hospital Cove, some three miles below the city on the 17th inst. The remains have not been identified.

Thomas Turney, brickmason, a resident of this city, has disappeared and his wife, Mrs. Margaret C. Turney, is distressed at his unusual absence, and exceedingly anxious to learn of his whereabouts.

ANOTHER MURDER.—The unfortunate result of a quarrel between Lewis Davis and Samuel Robinson, on the 9th inst., has resulted in the death of Davis. The Coroner's jury found that Robinson inflicted the wound that caused the death of Davis, and he will be tried in the courts for murder.

Alderman Foster, procurator, exhibitor and delineator of the Moffet bell punch, had an exhibition of the B. P. at the Produce Exchange on Tuesday and Wednesday of this week. We understand that it was with a view to introduce to the notice of bibulous individuals who desire to have a record of their imbibitions to take home. It only costs a cent a drink, and would be invaluable in large families. Virginia has done a fair thing in its use by picking up all the valueless scrip in the interest of the Purveyors to his Majesty, King Alcohol, and a depleted State Treasury, and we see no reason why it might not work like a crab in Wilmington. Anyway, it is worth a trial, and as an introduction it might be placed on the corners of the principal streets of the city.

CITY FATHERS.—The Board of Aldermen met on Tuesday evening, in special session, called by his Honor, Mayor Fishplate.

After the reading of the minutes and sundry minor matters were disposed of, the Board proceeded to consider the number and pay of the police force for the coming municipal year.

Alderman Foster introduced a resolution establishing the status of the force at two-fifths colored and three-fifths white, and that twenty-five privates shall be the minimum for the year.

Alderman Flanner offered a substitute, which was passed, and read as follows:

Resolved, That the police force shall consist of the Chief of Police, two Captains, two Sergeants and twenty-five privates, the force to remain as now constituted, and the additional number to be appointed by the Mayor. The health officers, not to exceed five, shall be selected from the force by the Mayor.

Yeas—Bowden, Hill, Flanner, Lowery, Myers, Vollers, King, VonGlahn, Nays—Foster.

The consideration of the election of

other city officers was deferred to another meeting of the Board.

Messrs. Hill and King made a special report—no action thereon.

The City Treasurer was authorized to correct an error.

A communication from Messrs. Alex. Sprunt & Son was received, and these gentlemen and ex-Mayor Canaday were invited to appear at the next regular meeting.

The market house building was ordered to be renovated and painted, and the police to have new uniforms, under the direction of the Mayor.

The Superintendent of Health reported, the Board then adjourned to the following Thursday evening.

MAYOR'S COURT.—Chief Magistrate Fishplate has performed his judicial functions at the city hall, during the past week, with his usual discrimination of justice. He ordered storm signals set on a few breakers of the law, which caused them to remain under the smiles of his Honor until the weather moderated. One unfortunate concluded that he would "ante-up" two police officers, but was "raised" \$50 by the court, passed out.

Two sons of the sea obtained breech loaders and hunted for larks, the recoil was too much, his Honor thought about \$2.50.

Several who want to see their names in the newspapers again, concluded to explain their grievances to twelve men in the higher court of civil service reform, his Honor consulted with his distinguished guests and they accepted the invitation of Gen. Manning to visit him at his villa during their stay here.

Names are so easily obtained since the passage of the silver bill that they are unimportant in the columns of a newspaper, our record, therefore, is only general and ceases here for the week.


