Homesteads vs. Old Debts.

The Constitution of the United States does not allow any state to pass an ex post facto law, nor legislate so as to impair the right of contracts, which if true, the sundry stay laws, and limitation acts passed during and since the late rebellion are unconstitutional aud void, and we think that those who propose to collect their ante-bellum debts have slept too long upon their supposed rights, to expect a court of justice to afford them relief. If the General Assembly had no right to stop the statute of limitation, it had no power to make the limitation acts retroactive retrospective, so as to bring old debts in date. We have had much unconstitutional legislation since A. D. 1861, causing great injury to the estates of our people, which cannot be repaired. Financially most of us are impoverished by bad legislation, therefore we would suggest to those who hold old claims against the people to destroy them, or allow them to be compromised at the estimated value placed upon them when given in for taxation. We are inclined to believe that but few, if any of the old debts contracted upon the faith of negro property ought to be paid, considering the relations we now
