

WHAT KILPATRICK SAYS. Gen. Judson Kilpatrick made a telling speech the other day at a ratification meeting for GARFIELD and ARTHUR, which was bristling with plain talk, and in which he wielded a two-edged sword.

The speaker claimed that at Cincinnati the Democrats committed a series of blunders. They kicked out Kelly and insulted Tilden, Bayard, Thurman, and Hendricks, and discarded all their past issues and platforms. They nominated a patriot who 16 years ago would not have crossed hands with one man in ten of them.

It was hardly a less blunder to nominate W. H. English, who was able to amass \$1,000,000 for every year he was in the note-making business—the most unpopular Democrat west of the Ohio to carry Indiana, the hotel of inflation and repudiation.

The closing part of his speech is about as good and inspiring and refreshing as anything in the English language can be.

The Democrats place all their dependence on Hancock's name. They care nothing for principles; they only want plunder.
