Rules and Regulations for the Organization of the Republican Party of North Carolina:

We republish below the plan of organization adopted by the Republican State Convention in 1850, which will have to be carried out during the present campaign, and the Republicans of the state will do well to study it so as to be able to carry it out."

1. County Organization. - The election precinct shall be the unit of county organization. Each precinct shall have an executive committee consisting of three active Republicans. They shall be biennially chosen by the Republican voters of the precinct, and shall elect one of their number chairman. They shall convene together at such time and place as the majority of them may elect They shall biennially elect a county executive committee, to consist of not less than five members, who shall elect a chairman from their? number. Vacancies in precinct committees shall be fill day the voters of the precinct, and in county committees by a convention of the precinct committees duly called: Provided, that in case a vacancy occurs within thirty days prior to an election such vacancy may be filled by

the vote of the remaining members. II Congressional, Judicial and Senaforial Districts .- There shall be a Congre sional, Judicial and Senatorial District Committee, composed of not less than one member from each county, nor less than seven members, biennially elected by the several d strict conventions, each of whom shall elect a chairman from their number: Frovided, that a senatorial district committee shall only be elected in districts embracing more than one county. Vacancies occurring within thirty days of an election may be filled by the rote of the

III State Executive Committee. -There shall be a State Executive Courmittee, composed of one member from each Congressional District in the state, to be designated by the district delegations in State Convention assembled; two members at large, to be elected by the State Convention, and the chairman of the convention at which the election is held. They shall be biennially elegted at the State Convention, shall choose one of their number chairman, and shall elect a secretary who is not a member, who shall reside at Raleigh.

IV. The chairman of the respective county, district and State Executive Committees shall call their conventions to order and act as temporary chairmen until a permanent ogganization is affeeted, with power only to appoint, and receive the report of, a committee on DAY, WEEK, and

V. No executive committee shall have power to elect or appoint delegates to any convention, whether county, district, State or National.

VI An member of an executive committee or delegate or atternate duly chosen shall have power to delegate his trust or authority to another,

VII. Representation. - Representation in county conventions shall consist of three Republican voters as delegates, and three as alternates, from each precinct it the county, and no

VIII. Representation in Congressional, Judicial, Senatorial and State Conventions shall consist of two delega'es and two alternates only, for every member of the lower House of the General Assembly and shall be apportioned in the several counties accord-

1X. Delegates and alternates to county conventions shall be elected only by a vote of the Republicans of each precinct in precinct meeting as sembled; and delegates and alternates to district, State and National conventions shall be elected by a convention of delegates duly elected and sent by the people for that purpose after due notice and publication of not less than fifteen days, of the time, place and purpose of such convention, and not other

X. The certificate of the chairman and secretary of the meeting, setting forth regularity of the primary meeting or convention, and the election of the delegate and alternate thereat, shall be accepted, when uncontested, as a good and sufficient credential for such dete-

gate and alternate.

XI. This plan of organization and procedure shall continue in force until changed or abrogated by a sebsequent Republican State Convention.


