Newton Normal School The third session of the Newton Normal School will open June 26th, and close July 27th.

The board of managers have secured the services of an able corps of instructors, and can insure teachers in every art of the state that the normal of 1883 will be of a very high grade. Prof. N. C. English, superintendent of the Greensboro graded school, will be superintendent, and the faculty will include Prof. M. C. S. Nobles, superintendant of the graded schools of Wilmington.

WASHINGTON, May v.-The Florida Ship Canal Company effected an organization at a stockholders meeting in this city last night, by the election of ex-Governor John C. Brown, of Tenn., as President; Hon. William Windom. Vice-President; George U. Gorham, Secretary; S. T. Meyer, Treasurer; and Gen. Chas. Stone, Chief Engineer; and the following directors: John C. Brown Wm. Windom, Gov. Benjamin F. Butler, Senator Wm. Mahone, Townsend Cox, Governor Wm. E. Cameron, S. T. Meyer, A. W. Jones, A. S. Mann, M. Jacobs, v. D. Groner, and Senator John H. Jones. It was announced that \$26,000,000 had been subscribed to the capital stock of the company. Gen. Stone will place a corps of engineers in the field without delay, and the work is expected to be under contract by the first of September. It is estimated that the canal will cost \$30,000,000, and will be completed in three years. The proposed route will leave St. John's river above Jacksonville, and thence in a direct line as nearly as possible to Suwanee river, on the Gulf of Mexico. making a tide water canal of less than one hundred miles in length and deep enough to float the largest ocean steamer from ocean to gulf.

RICHMOND, Va., May 7, 1883. The legal troubles of the White Sulpher Springs property have broken out afresh, culminating in a conflict of jurisdiction between Judge Bond, of the United States Circuit Court, and Judge Jackson, of the United States District Court, of West Virginia. There are rival suits of creditors in both courts asking for the appointment of a receiver. The first of these was instituted in the United States District Court West Virginia, and pending proceedings Judge Jackson placed a marshal in charge of the property. Subserival suits of creditors in both courts quently Judge Bond, on the petition of other creditors, appointed A. L. Boul-ware, of this city, receiver, ignoring the previous action of Judge Jackson. Boulware took formal possession of the property about two weeks ago in the absence of Judge Jackson's marshal. The latter, however, to day found Boulware, Judge Bond's receiver, at the White Sulphur giving orders, whereupon he arrested him for obstructing him (the Marshal) in the execution of an order of the District Court, Boulware was taken to Charleston, W. Va., where he will be brought before Judge Jackson, who has set to-morrow to act upon the original petition of the creditors in his court for the appointment of a receiver. The conflict is a novel one, and will probably result in an appeal to Chief Justice Waite as to which of the judges has the right to ap-point the receiver or whether either shall do so.


