OFFICE PROVOST MARSHAL GENERAL. (ARMY OF THE OHIO.)

Wilmington, N. C., March 1st, 1865. The following order is published for the benefit of all concerned :-

i. * All contraband goods shall be reported to he Provost Marshal, and taken possession of by tum, according to special instructions.

II. Stores and shops of loyal people can be open ed, and stocks now on hand sold, which can be renewed only in accordance with the permission of aragraph 5, General Order, No. 8, Head Quarters Department of North Carolina. The Provost Marshal will see that prices are reasonable.

III. No Liquor shall be sold to enlisted men under any circumstances, nor to citizens, except by authorized Druggists, who may sell by the single bottle or small measure, upon the certificate of a reguiar Physician, to the effect that it is necessary for m dical purposes-said certificate to be retained by the seller, and subject to the inspection of the Pro-

IV. If necessary, regulations shall be established from time to time, regulating the 'prices' of provi-

V. No property of any kind, not required for present military use, shall be seized, unless by authority of the Provost Marshal, who shall keep a careful record of the same -name of owner, amount &c., a certificate of which he may give, which certil cate must be recorded.

VI. All places of husiness, excepting those connected with the Clove.nment, and Druggists, shall close at 8 P. M.

VII. People coming from the country to the city with marketing, will proceed directly to the Market House, 6n Market Street, where an officer of the Provost Marshal Department, will inspect his produe and give him permission in writing to sell if he shan deem it advisable, and also a pass out of the

HEADQ'RS DEPARTMENT OF N. C., (ARMY OF THE OHIO,). Wilmington, N. C., Feb. 27, 1865. GENERAL ORDERS, ?

No. 8. I. Provost Marshals in this Department will administer the oath of allegiance to such persons as come within the provisions of the Amnesty Proclamation of the President of the United States, provided they are satisfied that such persons desir u good faith to aid in restoring the national authority

and that they take the oath of allegiance cheerfully

and voluntarily. II. Reports will be made weekly to the Provost Marshal General, giving the name, age, and place of residence of every person who shall have subscribed to the oath of allegiance; -also of all o ther adult white persons residing within the jurisdicti on of each Provost Marshal, together with such info cmation as can be obtained touching the character and conduct

of each individual. III. Persons of known disloyalty, and those who shall by their language or conduct manifes t hostility to the Government of the United States, shall be sent beyond the lines of the army by an order from the Provost Marshal General, or be brought before a Military Commission for trial and pur lishment, according to the nature of the offence.

IV. Officers authorized by law to appoint General Courts Martial are empowered to appoint Military Commissions, and to confirm and execute the sentences of such Commissions, with the same limitations as in the case of General Courts Martia !.

V. Commercial intercourse within the limits of this Department will be governed strictly by the laws of the United States and the regulations of the Treasury Department; and will be limited to that which may be necessary to supply the wants of the loyal people residing within the lines of military occupation, and persons in the employ of the government. None but persons of undoubted loy alty and good character will be permitted to trade within the limits of the Department.

VI. Intercourse between towns occupied by the army and the surrounding country within the lines of military occapation, will be permitted, under regulations to be established by the Provost Marshal General, for the purpose of enabling the inhabitants to supply themselves with the necessaries of life.

VII. The loval people of the country residing within the lines of the army, will be permitted to bring freely to market the products of their farms, and to receive in payment the curren cy of the United States. They will also be permaitted to purchase family supplies from persons authorized to trade, upon permits granted by the local Provost Marshals.

VIII. Rail Roads and Telegraph lin es are under special military protection. Any perso n who shall break, injure or in any manner interfere with their military use, or shall fire into any Rail I toad train, or vessel pavigating the waters of this De partment, shall be punished with death, or otherwise, at the discretion of a Military Commission.

IX. The destruction of property, public or private, is a waste of the national wealth, and alike injurious to the people and to the Governme nt. It is therefore to be avoided, except where military operations render it necessary. The highest Counmander present must alone be the judge of such necessity.

X. The troops will be supplied with such of the products of the country, especially vegetables, as are necessary for their health and comfort, This must be done by the proper Staff Officers acting under the orders of the Division and Brigade Commanders.

XI. Straggling, and irregular foraging by individuals, are prohibted, and will be severely punished. By command of Major General SCHOFLELD:
