Morton, among other things, dwelt upon the question of adjustment, in which he condemned the doctrine of secession, suggested that the rebels were personally liable for their treason, and that there was no power to punish them collectively by reducing a state to a territorial condition, or declaring its municipal character forfeited. He declared that the state governments could not be destroyed by the acts of individuals, whether they were officers of that government or private citizens. These declarations seem to have incited President Johnson to a more complete enunciation of his views upon this tions seem to have incited President Johnson to a more complete enunciation of his views upon this matter than has yet been made by him. He declared his intention to punish treason in the same decided manner as heretofore. Upon the question of reconstruction, and how it was to be effected, he used the following significant language:—

Upon this idea of destroying states, my positiongins been heretofore well known, and I see no cause to change it now, and I am glad to hear its reiteration on the present occasion. Some are satisfied with the idea that the states are to be sost in territories and other divisious; are to tose their character as states. But their life breath has been only suspended, and it is a high constitutional obligation we have to secure each of these states in the possession and enjoyment of a republican form of government. A state may be in the government with a peculiar institution, and by the operation of robeliton lose that feature; but it was a state when it went into rebellion, and when it comes out without the institution, it is still a state.

I hold it as a solemn obligation in any one of these States where the rubel armies have been beaten back or expelled, I care not how small the number of union men, if enough to man the ship of state—I hold it, I say, a high duty to protect and secure to them a republican form of government.
