LONDON, July 16—25.

Undisputed intelligence is said to have reached our government, that upon receiving the news respecting the Duke d'Enghien, for the Russian Minister, Benapat, in a climax of rage, wrote a note with his own hand to the Emperor of Russia in the most vindictive manner. This was instantly dispatched but after several hours remonstrances from Talleyrand another court was dispatched to stop the delivery of this philippic. The messenger reached Petersburg on the fore day but the flaming note arriving first has been delivered. The Emperor of Russia has ordered copies of it to be sent to every Court in Europe, and this said to be of a most true description. The most likely circumstance to accelerate a rupture between Russia and France is the formal rejection which, we understand, accounts from Warsaw, of the 5th inst. the Emperor Alexander has recently given, to Louis XVIII. A Russian nobleman is stated to have arrived in that city with a letter writ-
