The Insurrection at an End. THE PRESIDENT'S PROCLAMATION. The Election in Connecticut. LATEST FROM EUROPE.

The following is from the evening edition of the Times: WASHINGTON, April 3.—The President's proclamation declaring the insurrection at an end, was published to-day. It asserts that the constitution provides for the constituent communities only as States, and not as territories, dependencies, provinces or protectorates, and that such constituent States must therefore necessarily be made equals and placed upon a like footing as to political rights, immunities, dignity and power with the several States with which they are united.
