The Insurrection at an End THE PRESIDENT'S PROCLAMATION

The Election In Connecticut LATEST FROM EUROPE.

The following is from the evening edit tion of the Times:

WASHINGTON, April 3 .- The President's proclamation declaring the insur rection at an end, was published to-day It asserts that the constitution provide for the constituent communities only States, and not as territories, dependen cies, provinces or protectorates, and the such constituent States must therefore necessarily be made equals and placed upon a like footing as to political rights, immunities, dignity and power with the several States with which they are united. It declares standing armies, militery occupation, martial law, military tribunals and the suspension of the writ of habeas corpus in time of peace dangerous to public liberty, incompatible with individual rights of citizens, contrary to the genius and spirit of our institutions, and COPPERAS, & ib exhaustive of national resources, and ought not therefore be sanctioned or allowed except in cases of actual necessity for repelling invasions or suppressing insurrections or rebellion, and further, that the people of the Southern States have given satisfactory evidence that they acquiesce in the sovereign and important resolution that each State ought to remain | FLOUR-Family. and constitute an integral part of the United States. Nothing other than the above is said about the writ of habeas corpus, neither does the proclamation make any allusion to a general pardon.
