Republican Nominating Convention.

A Republican County Convention for the County of Craven, N. C., is hereby called, to meet at the Court House in the city of New Berne, at 2 p. m., on Wednesday the 21st day of October, 1868, for the purpose of placing in nomination a candidate to fill the vacancy in the House of Representatives occasioned by the resignation of the Hon. A. S. Seymour.

The following apportionment of delegates for the different voting Precincts of the county have been agreed upon: ad hinc si.

Fifth Election Precinct, James City, three delegates.

Sixth Election Precinct, Wiggin's, two delegates.

Seventh Election Precinct, Iva, two delegates.

Eighth Election Precinct, Core Creek, one delegate.

Ninth Election Precinct, Little Swift Creek, one delegate.

Tenth Election Precinct, Big Swift Creek, two delegates.

Eleventh Election Precinct, Russell's, two delegates.

Twelfth Election Precinct, Adam's Creek, two delegates.

Thirteenth Election Precinct, Latham's, one delegate.

Fourteenth Election Precinct, Baird's, one delegate.

Fifteenth Election Precinct, Brown's, one delegate.

Sixteenth Election Precinct, Bay River, two delegates.

Seventeenth Election Precinct, Vandemere, one delegate.
