A God send! That "U. L. & C. G." Circular that the Journal of LIES was so fortunate in getting hold of, is a perfect god send to them. After having exhausted all the usual political capital in endeavoring to bolster up their miserable played out old party, we reiterate that they trumped up this miserable humbug circular, knowing that a publication of it would immediately result in an indignant denial of its authenticity by this paper.

The object they had in view has been accomplished; and we could not, knowing as we do the utter falsity of the whole thing, calmly allow it to go before the public uncontradicted—and behold! their object is attained. Our denial gives them subject for two columns of their most loved material lies.

We believe that the gentlemen, whose names are attached to the Card, stating the manner of discovery of the precious documents, are honest in their belief and in their share of the transaction; but that does not alter the fact of the "Job being put up." What we stated in our issue of Wednesday we again reiterate, namely: that the whole thing, from beginning to end, is a "Put up Job," and to give further reasons for our belief, we would state: First, From a knowledge of the fact, that there has not been a meeting of the U. L. A. held in the city of New Berne or the county of Craven since last April, or, to the best of our knowledge, in the whole State of North Carolina. Second, That had this document originated from the U. L. A.'s Headquarters, it would have had the initials U. L. A. instead of U. L. & C. G. Third, That there is no organization in the country in connection with the Republican party to which the initials C. G. apply, neither has any explanation been given by any one for them but by the people in the Journal of LIES' office, who declare that they stand for Colored Guard, an organization, we presume, that exists only in the fanciful imagination of the Journal's people. Fourth, That the language of that Circular is precisely similar to the language that has appeared in the Journal on several occasions during the last year, when predicting or anticipating the result of "Radical teachings," and if required so great ability to concoct or get up a thing of this kind, as a cursory glance, and an occasional cull from the Journal's columns during that time with a little discretion in fitting these calls together, would originate just such a document as this miserable Circular.

Shame upon the authors of this miserable, flimsy thing, and shame upon the editor of a paper who, professing to be capable of exercising judgment and discretion, would so allow vindictive party feeling to get the better of that professed judgment, as to permit such an apparent base LIE to appear in the columns of his paper.

Superior Court.—This Court did not convene yesterday until 2 o'clock in the afternoon, owing to the continued sickness of Judge Thomas.

Two cases were tried yesterday. Abby Cradle, a colored woman, for killing a man a few miles in the country with a live some three months ago. The case being tried, the woman's counsel submitted the case under a charge of manslaughter, a verdict of which the jury rendered. She was sentenced to one year's imprisonment.

Henry Brandon, the little boy that killed the girl in the Market some time ago with a butcher knife, submitted through his counsel to a verdict of manslaughter, a verdict of which the jury returned, and the Judge sentenced him to one year's imprisonment.

These two cases closed the criminal proceedings of this term of the Court. The Court will remain in session until the end of the week, but will only try cases in Equity. There is a large criminal docket for the next term of the Court, the Grand Jury, while in session, having found a number of bills of indictment. The Grand Jury were last evening discharged.
