AN ORDINANCE To lay Taxes and Provide for the Support of the City Government.

Sec. 1. It is ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of New Bern, that on the fiscal year ending June 30, 1869, a tax of one percent upon the value of all real estate within the limits of the corporation, be and the same is hereby laid to be collected as by law provided.

Sec. 7. And be it further ordained, That all Ordinances and parts of Ordinances conflicting herewith, be, and the same are hereby repealed.

AN ACT TO PUNISH BRIBERY AND COERCION IN ELECTIONS. Section 1. That it shall be unlawful for any person to offer any bribe to any of the qualified voters of this State with intent to influence his vote in any election.

Section 2. That it shall be unlawful for any person to attempt to influence the vote of any of the qualified voters of this State, in any election, by any threat to discharge such voter from employment or to withdraw from him patronage, or to discharge from employment, or refuse patronage to any member of such voter's family.

Section 3. That it shall be unlawful for any person to give a pecuniary or other consideration whatever, to any of the qualified voters of this State because of the vote which such voter may cast or may have cast in any election.

Section 4. That it shall be unlawful for any person to discharge from employment, withdraw patronage from, or otherwise injure, threaten, oppress or attempt to intimidate any of the qualified voters of this State because of the vote such voter may cast in any election.

Section 5. That any person violating any of the provisions of this act shall be guilty of a misdemeanor, and shall be liable to indictment for the same, and on conviction of having violated the provisions of section one, shall be fined not less than twenty dollars, or imprisoned not less than ten days.
