THE RESULT IN THE STATE. The returns have come in very slowly, but we now have the official figures from sixty-one (61) out of the 89 counties of North Carolina, and can give a close approximation to our majority:

These sixty-one counties gave last spring 132,845, the remaining twenty-eight gave 33,598 votes.

The Republican loss in the counties heard from is 8,600 on the vote for the Constitution.

A loss of the same per cent. in the remainder of the State would make Grant's majority 8,260 less than that for the Constitution, that is, 10,849.

As the per centage of loss is somewhat different in different sections of the State we have classified the counties into Eastern, Middle and Western N. C., for the purpose of making as accurate a statement of the majority as is possible with the present returns:

Grant's majority 10,704. We do not think the full canvass will materially vary these figures.

It must be remembered that our loss is only a comparative one. In Wake County where the Democrats made a gain of nearly 500, Grant's vote is about 190 larger than that cast for the Constitution. We are confident that the Republican vote is by several thousands larger than it was in the Spring.

It is estimated that there were seventeen thousand persons in the State disfranchised by the reconstruction acts who were enabled to vote by the new Constitution, the great mass of whom undoubtedly voted for Seymour; and

now no reserve,—(there are no disfranchised Rebels in the State);—and in the largest vote ever cast, North Carolina has given to any Presidential candidate since 1840. In view of the fact that the Democracy used every effort, and confidently expected to carry the State these figures are very satisfactory. We have a good working majority but cannot afford to lie on our oars.
