The Live Murderer - At the inquest held by Coroner Young upon the body of Elijah James, the man that was murdered on last Saturday in the neighborhood of the Brick Yard, by Mingo Jones, alias Small Wood, it appeared from the evidence adduced that on the day of the murder, James' wife went upon the premises of Jones to pick up some wood and was ordered off by Jones, but not being quick enough in obediency, was seized roughly by Jones James meeting Jones soon after, upbraided him with using violence towards his (James) wife, and Jones retaliated by discharging the contents of a gun, which he carried at the time, into the body of James, causing death soon after. The murderer was arrested and is now in Jail.

The Jury in the case rendered a verdict that Elijah James came to his death from gun shot wounds from a gun while in the hands of Mingo Jones.
