SPECIAL TERM OF THE SUPERIOR COURT.—Judge Thomas yesterday received a telegram from Gov. Holden, desiring him to hold a special term of his Court in Fayetteville.—The Judge telegraphed that a special term of Court was much needed here, and suggested the issuing of the order. We sincerely hope that the Judge's suggestion will be acted upon as our jail is fairly crowded with untried prisoners, of whom no disposition can be made until they are tried. By all means let us have a special term of Court.

RELEASED.—Judge Thomas yesterday issued a writ of habeas corpus in the case of Thomas Jones, who has been in jail for some time, awaiting trial for a deadly assault on Jacob Moulton. After a hearing Jones was admitted to bail in the sum of \$500 for his appearance at the next term of the Superior Court.

A writ of habeas corpus was issued in the case of Nelson now in jail for killing Charles Crawford. Judge Thomas will examine the case on Monday.
