CRAVEN COUNTY TOWNSHIPS

The following are the Boundary Lines, established by the Board of County Commissioners, for the nine Townships, into which the county of Craven has been divided:

No. 1. Beginning on the Neuse River at the Pitt County line, and running along said line to the intersection of the Broadleaf County line, thence along Broadleaf County line to the road in Blount's Creek on said line, thence down said road to Little Swift Creek, thence along said road to Big Swift Creek, thence down Big Swift Creek to Neuse river, thence up Neuse river to the Pitt County line, the beginning.

No. 2. Beginning at the intersection of the Broadleaf County line, and the old Pamlico road, and running along the Broadleaf County line to the head of Jones Bay, thence down Jones Bay to Hay river, thence up Hay river to Hay river Mills, thence up Hay river road to old Pamlico road, thence up said road to Broadleaf County line, the beginning.

No. 3. Beginning at the intersection of the Hay river road and the old Pamlico road and running along the Hay river road to Hay river Mills, thence down Hay river to Pamlico Sound, thence along said road to Neuse river, thence along said road to old Pamlico road, thence up said road to the beginning.

No. 4. Beginning at the mouth of Hancock's Creek and running down Neuse river to Turpin Bay, thence up Turpin Bay to the Craven County line, thence along said County line to Hancock's Creek, thence down said road to the Neuse river, the beginning.

No. 5. Beginning at the mouth of Oiler Creek and running down Neuse river to the mouth of Hancock's Creek, thence up said road to the intersection of the Hancock's Creek and the Pamlico road, thence along said road to the intersection of the Pamlico road and the old Pamlico road, thence along said road to the old Pamlico road, thence down said road to the Neuse river, the beginning.

No. 6. Beginning at the mouth of Bachelor's Creek and running down Neuse river to the mouth of Deep Gully Branch, thence up Deep Gully Branch to the Neuse river, the beginning.

No. 7. Beginning at the Jones County line on Trent river, and running down said river to Neuse river, thence down Neuse river to the mouth of Oiler Creek, thence up Oiler Creek to the Broadleaf road, thence up said road to the intersection of the Broadleaf road and the Pamlico road, thence along said road to the intersection of the Pamlico road and the old Pamlico road, thence along said road to the old Pamlico road, thence down said road to the Neuse river, the beginning.

No. 8. Beginning at the mouth of Bachelor's Creek and running down Neuse river to the mouth of Deep Gully Branch, thence up Deep Gully Branch to the Neuse river, the beginning.

No. 9. Beginning at the Lenoir County line on Neuse river, and running down said river to the mouth of Bachelor's Creek, thence up Bachelor's Creek to its head, thence direct from said creek to Deep Gully Branch, thence down Deep Gully Branch to the junction with the Jones County line, thence along with the said County line to the Lenoir County line, thence along said line to Neuse river the beginning.
