

EIGHT DAYS LATER FROM EUROPE.

New York, Oct. 25, 1833. By the arrival yesterday of the packet ships, North America, from Liverpool; York from London; and Havre from Havre, we have received London dates of Sept. 15th, and Liverpool of the 16th.

Parliament not being in session, our English papers are more barren than usual. Donna Maria the Queen of Portugal, had been received at Portsmouth with suitable honours, and, to use the language of the Liverpool Albion, with a cordiality due to her intimate relations with that country.

IRELAND.—The New Lord Lieutenant—The Marquis Wellesley is expected in Dublin on the 26th inst., with full powers to resume the reins of Vice Regal Government.

Retirement of the Lord Lieutenant.—The Marquis of Anglesea reached Dublin on Tuesday, having made the journey for the express purpose of receiving the new Lord Lieutenant, and personally resigning into his hands the government of his lands.

FRANCE. PARIS, Sept. 12th.—The accounts received from Rouen, which have reached us this morning, contain little more respecting the movements of the King and Royal Family, than the intelligence that has been communicated by telegraph.
