[BY AUTHORITY.] LAWS OF THE UNITED STATES PASSED AT THE FIRST SESSION OF THE TWENTY-FOURTH CONGRESS

AN ACT making appropriations for the current expenses of the Indian Department, for Indian annuities and other similar objects, for the year one thousand eight hundred and thirty-six.

Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representatives of the United States of America in Congress assembled, That the following sums be and the same are hereby, appropriated, for the objects hereinafter mentioned...

For the purchase of provisions for Indians, at the distribution of annuities, while on visits of business with the superintendents and agents, and when assembled on public business...

TO THE SIX NATIONS OF INDIANS IN NEW YORK. For the permanent annuity, stipulated in the sixth article of the treaty with them...

TO THE SENECAS OF NEW YORK. For the permanent annuity, in lieu of interest on stock, provided for by the act of the nineteenth of February, eighteen hundred and thirty-one...

TO THE OTTAWAS. For the permanent annuity, stipulated in the fourth article of the treaty with them, of the third of August, seventeen hundred and ninety-five...

TO THE WYANDOTS. For the permanent annuity, stipulated in the fourth article of the treaty of the third of August, seventeen hundred and ninety-five...

TO THE WYANDOTS, MUNSEES AND DELAWARES. For the permanent annuity, stipulated in the fourth article of the treaty with them of the fourth of July, eighteen hundred and five...

TO THE CHRISTIAN INDIANS. For the permanent annuity, per act of the thirtieth of May, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, four hundred dollars.

TO THE MIAMIENS. For the permanent annuity, stipulated in the fourth article of the treaty with them, of the twenty-third of October, eighteen hundred and twenty-six, twenty-five thousand dollars.
