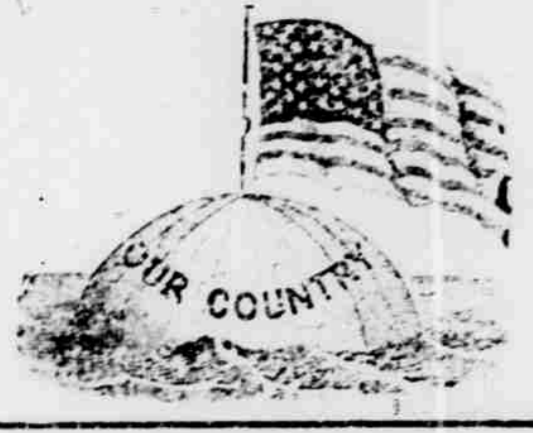

H. TELLS THE NEW ENGLANDERS WHY THE SOUTH IS SOLID. Rev. Thomas Dixon, the young North Carolina preacher who has recently been called from a church in Boston to one in New York, has been addressing the Paint and Oil Club of New England on the Southern question.

"They did what you would have done; they took possession of their local governments; they had it to do or give up the struggle of life. They violated the constitution you say?
