Death of Ex-Governor Holden.

At 30 minutes past one o'clock on yesterday the soul of William W. Holden, ex-Governor of North Carolina, left its earthly tenement, and as his old pastor, Rev. W. C. Norman, said to us, it has gone to its home above. What ever his faults and failings, and what ever his character in the troublous political times, we believe that he strived to live the life of a Christian with advancing years, and that he was at peace with God and man. We have received from several who knew him intimately in his later years such testimony as assures us that with this able, distinguished and aged citizen all is well with him now. "After life's fitful fever he sleeps well."

It is not our purpose to become his eulogist or assessor. His life record is known to most North Carolinians. He was born, we think, in Orange county. He was a printer in early manhood. He read law, and then became an editor. His ability was generally recognized. As editor of the Democratic organ at Raleigh, the Standard, for some twenty years, he exerted a very great influence. He wrote well, and was adroit as an advocate with the pen. He became Governor by reason of the results of the war, and was broken of his high office after being debarred from holding office again in North Carolina.

We knew him well. Our acquaintance began in 1845. He was a very agreeable and entertaining man, full of discourse and very willing to oblige. He had been a reader of books, and was cultured beyond most editors. He was a man of many good qualities, but until grace did the precious and most important work for him, he was extremely ambitious, envious of men born in the higher ranks of life, bitter in his hatreds, and rancorous towards political foes. He said much that was evil, and did harm, no doubt, to his native Carolina. But he was naturally by no means devoid of excellent qualities. He was very highly esteemed by his intimate associates. He was of really excellent talents, and was one of the half dozen ablest men in North Carolina who have made journalism a profession. He was probably past his 75th year. We have no sketch of his life at hand. He achieved distinction, made money, was unfortunate, and then at last, through God's infinite mercy, died a believer in the Lord Jesus Christ. He was a member of the Methodist Church.

Mr. Marion Butler's View.

[State Chronicle, Mar. 6.] President Butler, of the State Alliance, was interviewed yesterday and said: "I tell you this Hill movement is worked up in the towns; it is not in the country. Take Sampson county, for instance, my own county; if there were only the two men Cleveland and Hill to choose from, Cleveland would get a majority of votes. I would, in such a case, vote for Cleveland myself. Yet you must not imagine that I am a Cleveland man. Neither Cleveland nor Hill could carry that county or the State. Our people will not support a New York man. They are prejudiced against New York men. This is not a theory, but a condition. They are tired of these attempts to force them to take Cleveland or Hill, and if such a course is continued there will certainly be trouble." Mr. Butler spoke with great earnestness.
