Cleveland Already Has a Majority.

The Baltimore Sun says: "The anti-Hill Democrats in New York seem to have solid ground for the prediction that their delegation will be recognized by the National Democratic Convention, for, according to a dispatch from New York to the Boston Herald, 'the developments of the past two weeks have demonstrated that more than a majority of the whole Convention is even now certain to be enthusiastically in favor of the nomination of Grover Cleveland. The majority is sure—the only thing to speculate about is whether the Cleveland strength does not already cover two thirds of the Convention. That it will reach two-thirds before the Convention meets is a safe enough prediction.' The total number of delegates in the Convention is 900, and the Herald's correspondent estimates that of these 737 are practically assured to Cleveland. The States counted as 'solid' for Cleveland already are all of New England, Pennsylvania, New Jersey, Ohio, Indiana, Illinois, Michigan, Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota, Missouri, Nebraska, Iowa, Kansas, Kentucky, Tennessee, Texas and the whole of the Pacific coast."

NORTH CAROLINA NEWS.

Rev. Dr. C. T. Bailey, editor of the Biblical Recorder, is slowly recovering.

The farmers in the lower end of Halifax county will plant rice this year, and it successful in that direction will enter largely into the cultivation of that cereal hereafter.

Oxford Day: W. H. Osborn, son of our townsman, D. S. Osborn, is President of the North Carolina Keeley Cure Company. While the institute will remain in Greensboro, the headquarters of the company will be at Durham.

The Odd Fellows' Orphan Home at Goldsboro is now completed, and will be opened as soon as it can be furnished. A meeting of the trustees has been called to be held April 11th, to select a superintendent and other officers, &c., necessary to put the institution in active operation.

The first day of public fasting and prayer in America was ordered in North Carolina by the "Committee of Public Safety," of Rowan county, Nov. 11th, 1775, the Charlotte News states, and it says that North Carolina was also first to discourage the slave trade, as will be found from the proceedings of the same dated August 8, 1774.

A sad accident occurred at Winston just before a dark March 30th. Little Robert Townsend, the ten-year old son of a widowed lady, was playing on top of the new market house, which is in course of construction, and in his attempt to slide down a rope between two heavy joists, one of the latter fell catching young Townsend's head between the two, thereby breaking his neck. The body was not found until about twenty minutes after the accident.

Alamance Gleaner: Dr. Geo. K. Faust, the veteran fruit grower of this county, told us a few days ago that he thought very little of the fruit was killed by the recent cold snap, and that unless it got killed about the full moon in April there would be plenty. He has had an experience covering over thirty years and his observation is that during the full moon in April the fruit is more liable to be killed than at almost any other time of the year.

The State Chronicle says that the new hotel at Raleigh will be named "The Park," and that Mr. Page in selecting that name shows taste. The dimensions of the building, 102 x 86 feet, has been stated, as has also the height, four stories and basement. The brick work on the south and west sides will be just like that of the new depot. The design of the hotel does much credit to the taste of Mr. Bauer, the architect. The building will have eighty-five rooms. It will be a model as far as conveniences. The dining room will be on the south side, high above the sidewalk.
