By a vote of 184 to 11 the House of Representatives decided to pro-pose a constitutional amendment making Senators elective by the people.

Since the declaration of war the United States navy has taken nine Spanish steamers, nine schooners, two sloops and several fishing smacks, not to mention the destruction of the Spanish fleet at Manila. The value of the ships taken as prize money is \$3,000,000. The Spaniards have taken one American boat valued at \$40,000.

A fine monument to Zebulon Baird Vance was dedicated with appropriate ceremonies in Asheville Tuesday, May 10th. It will be many years before the men who now represent North Carolina in the United States Senate will be similarly honored. 


