

Extinction of New Jersey.

Richmond Virginian, speaking of the extinction of New Jersey for 999 years to a mania corporation, observes: "There is no space for even the enumeration of the important points settled by the bill, which is said by the Tribune to be very able and clear on all the points of the complaints," and "to content ourselves with presenting the main conclusions as to the danger apprehended from this 'great monopoly' that has New Jersey as its base, and which, that paper adds, 'is a monster which has grown up in the Legislature of the State in which it has ramifications.'"

"The decision completes a great moral victory for the Pennsylvania railway, of which the Hon. Thomas C. Smith is the controlling spirit, an unbroken way from tide-water in New York harbor to a point far out in the western part of the Rocky Mountains, and, possibly, to the Pacific. Such power to give to one corporation an interest which must be of healthy competition, and which will make itself felt in the Legislature, is a thing which has no parallel in our Virginia's history."

Scheme of Butler's.

It seems, from Washington telegrams, that Grant and Butler have been working together to contrive a scheme to remove Greeley. The crafty Butler is that Mr. Greeley's co-laborer, Senator Fenton, shall be the Grant ticket, for Vice President, and means of heading off Greeley by opposing the Republican feud. Butler links that Conkling object to such an arrangement, in the Vice Presidency is a mere position, without influence and fatal to the man who occupies it. If the Union statesman should accept this arrangement, Butler would not dare to break friendship with him, as his only strength now is the support given him by the Union. Butler is of the opinion that there is no substantial political advantage, and this arrangement forces him to follow Fenton's fortunes under the banner of the Union.
