METHOD OF AMENDMENT SETTLED.

THE PRESENT CONSTITUTION.

This Constitution and this party, with a radical, reckless and extravagant administration of the Federal Government, make up the manifest causes of the sufferings, poverty and ruin that crush the people of the State...

CONSTITUTIONAL AMENDMENTS SUGGESTED.

In the judgment of the Executive Committee, the Constitution should at once be amended in the following particulars:

OUR MATERIAL, INDUSTRIAL, AND EDUCATIONAL INTERESTS OPPRESSED.

That the material, industrial and educational interests of the State are in a calamitous condition is manifest to the commonest observer.

BURDENSOME TAXATION—PUBLIC EXTRAVAGANCE.

During the first two years under the present Constitution, \$1,807,580 were collected from the people, and every dollar

of this vast sum was expended in the administration of the State government...

These monstrous evils are the legitimate fruits of the workings of the present Constitution and radical misrule under it.

MISRULE, FRAUD, FORCE AND THE SWORD.

Under this organic law the people are subjected to an intolerable misrule at the hands of the radical party.
