A List of ACTS passed by the General Assembly of North-Carolina, at their Session held at Raleigh, in 1804.

An act to alter the time of holding the annual election in the county of Hertford and to establish two separate elections in said county.

2. To establish an Academy in the county of Greene.

3. For establishing two places for holding general musters in Brunswick county.

4. To revive, amend & continue in force certain acts for regulating the United States lands therein mentioned.

5. To amend an act passed in the year 1793, entitled "an act to amend an act passed at Newbern in the year 1777, entitled an act to encourage the building mills and directing the duty of millers."

6. Granting two separate elections to the inhabitants of Richmond county.

7. To authorise the county court of Chatham to levy a tax to defray the expence of building a court-house.

8. Granting a separate election to the inhabitants of the county of Randolph, and altering the time of holding the several separate elections in said county.

9. To divorce Benjamin Singletary of the county of Bladen, from his wife Sarah.

10. To amend an act entitled "an act making further compensation to the Jurors of Halifax and Edenton districts."

11. To amend the several acts of Assembly now in force for establishing permanently the dividing line between the counties of Montgomery and Moore.

12. Directing the duties of the Sheriff of Tyrrell county in holding the separate elections in that county.

13. To establish the mode of election in future in the county of Sampson.

14. To establish a separate election in the county of Chatham.

15. To alter and amend an act entitled "an act to alter the time of electing the members of the General Assembly passed at Fayetteville 1789, so far as respects the county of Gates."

16. To facilitate the navigation of lower Little River.

17. To repeal an act passed in the year 1803, entitled "an act to compel the Clerk of Surry county court to keep his office at or within two miles of the court-house."

18. For the better regulation of the town of Smithville and to amend an act entitled "an act to establish an Academy at Smithville in the county of Brunswick."

19. To authorise Benjamin Jones, Thomas Harvey, Enoch Sawyer, and Frederick B. Sawyer to cut a navigable canal and make a road thereon through the great Dismal Swamp, from the Dismal Swamp canal near the head of the woods in Camden county, to the white oak spring marsh in Gates county and to demand and receive toll thereon.

20. To authorise the wardens of the poor for the county of Perquimans to lay a tax higher than heretofore, and to regulate their proceedings in certain cases.

21. To raise a revenue for the payment of the civil list and contingent charges of government for the year 1805.

22. To amend an act passed in 1783 so far as respects the fines of the county court jurors.

23. To continue in force an act passed in the year 1801, entitled "an act to continue longer in force and to amend an act passed in the year 1799, entitled an act directing the Judges of the superior courts to meet together to settle questions of law or equity arising on the circuit, and to provide for the trial of persons concerned in certain frauds."

24. To amend an act entitled "an act empowering the county courts of pleas and quarter sessions to direct the Secretary of State to correct certain patents or grants therein described when there have been errors by the Surveyor in making the returns, or by the Secretary in issuing the same."

25. To amend and repeal in part an act passed in the year 1789, entitled "an act to establish an University in this state."

26. To amend an act entitled "an act appointing Commissioners to extend the boundary line of this state and the state of South-Carolina, passed in the year 1803."

27. To amend an act entitled "an act to authorise and empower the county court of Northampton to appoint some proper person to transcribe the Register's Books of said county" passed the last session of the General Assembly.

28. To repeal a part of an act entitled "an act allowing compensation to the superior and county court jurors, so far as relates to the county of Burke."

29. To amend an act passed in the year 1802, entitled "an act granting two separate elections to the inhabitants of Johnston

county, and to establish two other separate elections in said county."

30. Granting to the inhabitants of Surry county the privilege of a separate election in the town of Huntsville and at one other place in said county.

31. To establish a separate election in the county of Anson at the house of Jonathan Taylor.

32. To revise and amend an act entitled "an act for running and ascertaining the boundary line between the counties of Sampson and Johnston passed in the year 1803."

33. To revive and continue in force an act passed in the year 1795, entitled "an act giving further time for the registration of certain deeds issued from Lord Granville's office."

34. Granting separate elections in Brunswick county & for altering the time of holding elections in said county.

35. Giving further time to pay the purchase money to the state on entries of land therein mentioned, & fixing the time within which the purchase money on all entries which shall be made after the first day of January 1805, shall be paid into the public Treasury.

36. For the further limitation of actions.

37. To repeal part of the 14th clause or section of an act entitled "an act to remedy certain inconveniences arising under the present land laws," passed at the session of the General Assembly, on the 25th day of November 1796.

38. To alter the mode and provide more effectually for the election of commissioners of the town of Fayetteville.

39. To relieve certain inhabitants of Mecklenburg county and other citizens of this state.

40. To incorporate the Royal arch Chapter of Concord of Wilmington, N. Carolina.

41. To appoint and empower commissioners to contract with any person or persons for the purpose of opening & establishing a turn-pike road to pass through part of the territory belonging to the Cherokee Indians.

42. To continue in force for a longer time an act entitled "an act for the relief of non-commissioned officers and soldiers of the continental line and militia of this state, who have been disaided in the service of the U. States or of this state during the late war, and who are not placed on the pension list of the United States and are barred by the act of limitation passed in the year 1799."

43. To amend an act passed in the year 1803, entitled "an act granting 3 separate elections to the inhabitants of Robeson county."

44. To authorise the county court of Anson to appoint a proper person to transcribe such of the records in the Register's office as they may deem necessary.

45. To amend an act for making compensation to the jurors of Brunswick county.

46. To alter the place for holding a separate election in Bladen county.

47. To authorise the county court of Onslow to appoint a proper person to transcribe such of the records in the Register's office as said court should deem necessary.

48. To divorce Samuel Easton, marriener of the county of Carteret, from his wife Zilphia.

49. To amend an act passed by the last General Assembly, entitled "an act for establishing a mutual Insurance Society against fire on buildings, goods and furniture in this state."

50. To repeal so much of an act passed in the year 1741 as exempts constables from paying provincial, county and parish taxes.

51. To amend an act entitled "an act concerning proving wills and granting letters of administration, and to prevent frauds in the management of testates estates, passed in the year 1789."

52. To apportion the number of jurors to be sent to the superior court from the different counties in Fayetteville District.

53. Making further compensation to the jurors attending the county court of Cumberland.

54. Directing in what cases bail shall be given in actions of ejectment.

55. To establish an academy in the lower end of Caswell county.

56. To alter the time for appointing Sheriffs and levying the county taxes for the county of Buncombe.

57. To confirm a revival of certain acts of Assembly.

58. Giving further time for registering grants, proving deeds and mesne conveyances.

59. To revive and continue in force the acts passed declaring certain entries lapsed

notwithstanding the purchase money may have been paid in case they are not surveyed and registered into the Secretary's office within a limited time.

60. To incorporate two companies for the purpose of cutting a navigable canal from Bennet's creek in this state, to Nansemond river in the state of Virginia.

61. To repeal an act passed in the year 1801, granting separate elections in Onslow county.

62. To cede to the United States the jurisdiction of the land therein mentioned.

63. Directing where the separate election in the county of Ashe shall be holden in future.

64. To establish a separate election in the county of Moore.

65. To annex part of the county of Craven to the county of Lenoir and for other purposes.

66. Specifying the duties and salary of public printer.

67. To amend an act passed in the year 1803, to raise the jurisdiction of a justice of the peace out of court.

68. To repeal part of an act passed in the year '94, entitled "an act to empower the county court of New-Hanover to lay a tax for the purpose of destroying the vermin therein mentioned and for altering one of the places for holding the annual elections in the county of New-Hanover & to amend an act to encourage the destroying wolves, wild-cats, panthers, and bears, in the county of Carteret, passed in 92, so far as the said act relates to the county of New-Hanover."

69. Making compensation to the county court jurors of Richmond and for other purposes therein mentioned.

70. To amend an act entitled "an act establishing a separate election at Hogstown in the county of Martin and to repeal part of two laws passed in the year 1795 & 1797 granting separate elections at Hogstown & Jamestown in said county of Martin."

71. To amend an act passed in the year 1802, granting further compensation to witnesses or jurors to the district courts of this state so far as it respects the district of Newbern.

72. To revive and continue in force an act passed in the year 1803, entitled "an act giving longer time to the inhabitants of Richmond county to register certain claims in said county."

73. To establish a separate election at the house of Wm. M'Swain on first broad river in the county of Rutherford.

74. To provide for the better collection of the town taxes in the town of Wilmington.

75. To establish a separate election in Washington county.

76. To alter the place of holding the separate election on the south side of Neuse river in Wayne county.

77. To establish a separate election at the house of Charles M'Lan on the east side of Adams' creek in Craven county.

78. To amend an act entitled "an act to appoint and empower commissioners to contract with Phillip Hoodenpile & Joab Barnard for certain improvements on the warm spring road, passed in 1801."

79. To amend an act, entitled "an act to grant the inhabitants of Montgomery county the privilege of separate elections."

80. To incorporate the town of Hamilton.

81. To alter the divisional line between the counties of Mecklenburg and Cabarrus.

82. Establishing a boundary line between Pasquotank and Perquimans; and also between Camden and Gates counties.

83. Making further compensation to the jurors who may attend the county court of Halifax.

84. To establish a second separate election in the county of Pitt, at the house of Jesse Seefield, on the south side of Swifts creek swamp.

85. To amend an act entitled "an act to authorise Thomas Barnes of Robeson county to convey certain town lots in the town of Lumberton."

86. To establish an academy in Moore county.

87. To repeal so much of the tenth section of an act passed in the year 1795, entitled "an act to amend the laws heretofore passed concerning court-houses and prisons and to provide for the safe keeping and humane treatment of persons in confinement" as directs the manner of paying guards and to direct how in future compensation shall be made.

88. To alter the time for appointing Sheriffs & laying the county taxes for the county of Richmond.

89. To pardon and restore to credit Daniel Black of Guilford county.

90. To restore to credit Josiah Badget of Johnston county.

91. To restore to credit James Permenter of Anson county.

92. To secure to the persons therein named such property as they may hereafter acquire.

93. Establishing a Bank in Wilmington.

94. Granting separate elections in Edgcombe and Franklin.

95. To facilitate the navigation of the Yadkin river.

96. To amend an act entitled "an act better to ascertain how witnesses attending in behalf of the state in certain cases, shall be paid," passed in 1801, and to repeal that part of the same that provides for the payment of witnesses attending in behalf of the state in the courts of pleas and quarter sessions.

97. To establish inspections of produce in Huntsville, Surry county.

98. Respecting the jail for the district of Wilmington.

99. To exempt all regular bred physicians or practitioners of physic and surgery from serving as jurors either in county or superior courts.

100. To amend an act entitled "an act directing the manner of appointing electors to vote for president and vice president of the United States passed at the last session of the General Assembly."

101. To incorporate the Newbern marine insurance company, and to establish a bank in said town.

102. To empower Dolphin Davis to receive storage of Tobacco inspected and deposited in such ware-house or houses as he shall build in lower Fayetteville.

103. To authorise the companies of cavalry in Buncombe county to hold their musters and be reviewed at Ashville.

104. To alter the time of holding the county court of Wake.

105. To establish a separate election at the house of Jonathan Kimball, in Warren.

106. To alter the names of persons therein mentioned, and to legitimate them.

107. To empower the several captains in the different districts or companies in Richmond, Robeson and Montgomery to appoint patrols.

108. To repeal the 2d section of an act passed 1798, entitled "an act for the prevention of vice and immorality by suppressing excessive gaming."

109. For the relief of foreign seamen brought into the port of Wilmington.

110. To alter the divisional line between Mecklenburg and Cabarrus.

111. For laying a tax in the several counties within the district of Salisbury for the purpose of building a district jail.

112. For adding to the board of commissioners for the navigation of Occochee Inlet and regulating the pilots thereof.

113. Granting separate elections in Wake.

114. To continue an act passed 1802 entitled "an act authorising the county courts therein mentioned, to lay a tax for defraying the expences incurred in suppressing the late infection of the negroes in said counties, so far as respects the county of Pasquotank, and for other purposes."

115. To restore to credit Eben Macey of Guilford and Arthur Daves of Moore.

116. To amend the several procedural laws.

117. To authorise the commissioners of Hillsborough to have enclosed the public spain, school house, church lots and for other purposes.

118. To amend the act of 1789, "for the further regulation of Newbern."

119. For reviving the act of 1796, encouraging the cutting a navigable canal from Plymouth to Pungo river.

120. To repeal the act of 1800 making compensation to jurors of Carteret and Rowan, so far as respects Rowan.

121. To amend the acts of 1801 and 1803 granting separate elections in Duplin.

122. To prevent the falling of timbers into Ularre and Deep rivers in Randolph.

123. Authorizing Wm. Taylor of Mecklenburg in Virginia, to bring negroes willed to him into this state.

124. Empowering Martin court to lay a tax for the purpose of building a house for the poor, &c.

125. To open and make navigable Fishing creek from Seflums to Wyatt's bridge.

126. To emancipate a woman of colour named America and her daughter Jennina of Guilford.

127. For the relief of Mourning Sakes of Nalh.

128. To provide for the repairing or rebuilding the district jail of Edenton.

129. To repair the public jail, for the district of Fayetteville.

130. Altering the time and mode of holding the separate elections in Cumberland &c.

131. To legitimate Sally Hopkins Tison natural daughter of Thomas Tison of Pitt county.

132. To repeal an act of 1802 entitled "an act to establish a separate election at the house of William Judkins in Iredell county."
