The War on the President. Wednesday's encounter in the Senate was one of the most significant of the present season. Confronted with all his war paint, He evidently means bitter, relentless and protracted war on the administration.

The year just closing is what is termed an "off year" in politics. Little excitement has attended the contests in the various States, if we except those in New York, New Jersey, Pennsylvania and Ohio; but the results are not to be undervalued for that. They seem to indicate the direction taken by the popular tide, and Democrats may review the elections of the year with feelings of satisfaction. Out of the three and three-quarter millions of ballots cast in eighteen States, representing something more than one-half of the voting strength of the Union, there was a net Democratic gain, since last year, of a quarter of a million votes.

During the present year state elections of some sort were held in twenty-three States, but in several the contests gave no test even of approximate accuracy of the strength of parties, either because of their intrinsic character or for local causes to be described.

In California, Connecticut and Georgia the State vote was on constitutional amendments or conventions, in Colorado both parties voted for the same candidate for the bench, and in West Virginia the question on which suffrages were invited was the future location of the State capital. In Mississippi and Virginia organized opposition was offered to the regular Democratic nominees. Mentions of these States is therefore omitted. In Nebraska the contest was merely nominal, the Democrats holding no convention and the State committee merely advising the members of the party to vote for an independent nominee for one of the three offices to be filled, who was already in the field.

In the fifteen contested States the vote for the highest office to be filled is given. The States and offices are as follows: Iowa, Governor; Kansas, Local Governor; Kentucky, Governor; Maryland, Governor; Massachusetts, Governor; Michigan, Governor; Nebraska, Governor; New Hampshire, Governor; New Jersey, Governor; New York, Governor; North Carolina, Governor; Ohio, Governor; Pennsylvania, Governor; Rhode Island, Governor; Wisconsin, Governor.

The total Greenback vote in these States was 154,165. Prohibition, 42,480; Labor, 32,676, and scattering, 2,886; giving as the total votes of all the States the figures 3,468,213. In the same territory there were cast for President last year 4,582,984 votes, a falling off of this year of 1,114,771.

Comparing the majorities above it is seen that the total net Democratic gain is 109,094, Ohio taking the lead with a net gain of 90,036, Pennsylvania following with 24,484, and Massachusetts coming next with 23,286. For these statistics we are indebted to the New York World.

With such a record as this for the closing year, the Democratic party may enter the new year with high hopes of renewed success. The Republican party has long held in the communities of the North; it is a striking fact that the South, the scepter of which has fallen from its grasp, and the Gables and the Blaines do but labor in vain to restore it. In the dying words of its greatest leader, Oliver P. Morton, the Republican party may well exclaim: "I am worn out!"
