Better Times at the South. upon the subject which now engrosses

the thoughts of the people here : While the West is thriving like a young giant the question arises : What share is the South to have in the growing prosperity of the country? She has lain dormant for more than a generation. Slavery prevented the immigration of free laborers; war ploughed her with its iron share; the carpet bagger and the negro, upheld by Radical bayonets, robbed and plundered her until ber distress during the war was as nothing compared with her sufferings from the illegitimate results of the war; excessive taxation amounted to practical confiscation of property; Radical lies about "outrages" kept the recent influx of immigration away from her and sent it to the West; gnd, to crown all, the bard times came to give added weight to her many adversities.

On the other hand we find that despite all her wrongs and her ill-fortune of the past, she has abundant resources for material prosperity. She has a soil which is capable of producing some of the most valuable staples: even her "worn-out" lands are already cleared and improved, and could be restored by wise management at slight expense. She has a climate unexcelled in the world for productive purposes; she has four millions of professional laborers who only need to be set at work; she has a class of cultured and able leaders, who are pre-eminently qualified to look after her legislative and other essential needs. And now that she has cut loose from the paternal care of the Northern fanatic, has ousted the Northern carpet-bag thief, has shaken off the grip of Radical tyranny from her threat and stands erect in her independence and her rightful selfgovernment, she will wake up as from a long nightmare, will shake herself into shape, and commence to grow. She possesses in a marked degree every Nessential element of prosperity and rapid growth, and will go promptly forward to gather up these results.

The effects of this transformation of a barren and devastated country like the South into one that is teeming with people and products, are worthy of consideration, when viewed in their relation to the general welfare. What has hitherto been a personal gain to a few pol tical leaders in the practical confiscation of Southern property through one rous taxation and the piling up of fabulous State debts, has been a loss to the public in just the extent that it has reduced the value of that property for National taxation. The loss will be restored, and the South will be enabled to pay ber share of the National expenses. Specie Resumption.

After seventeen years of suspension the Governm nt resumed specie payments on the 1st of January, 1879. The Resumption act passed January, 1875, provides in brief: 1. On and after January 1, 1879 the

secretary of the treasury shall redeem in coins the United States legal tender notes then outstanding. 2. This redemption shall take place on the presen ation of such legal ten-

ders in sums of not less than \$50. 3. The place of redemption is at the office of the assistant treasurer of the

United States in the city of New York. 4. The redemption will be in either

tenders desires, subject to the option of the government to pay in either 5. The amount of these legal tenders is now \$345,681,016.

6. The legal tender shall not be destroyed, retired or cancelled, but shall be kept in circulation. 7. The act does not apply to the cir-

culation of the national banks. Their notes are still redeemed in United States notes at the courters of the entirely cured, I gained sixteen pounds in banks issuing them.

Anent this question the New York Nation observes: "The government has entered on the performance of an entirely new function-that of a bank of issue, which is, we believe, a novelty in the history of finance. Whatever may be the dangers which, after three months of resumption may be still ahead, owing either to the possibility of a turn in the balance of trade or the increasing abundance of silver, people will refuse to trouble their heads about them, and will settle down into the belief that the Treasury will for ever hereafter pay one bundred cents on the dollar, and they will insensibly adapt their business and their way of thinking on all business matters to this belief. Contracts and transactions of all sorts will grow up on it, and thus create a powerful body of influence against any other change, which will be very effective in preventing any other change, just as the growth of transactions on the irredeemable currency created a powerful body of influence hostile to resumption. which furnished a s.rong obstacle to resumption. The way in which business is reviving, to , is likely to prove very favo, able to the growth of stea y and seu d views about the currency. The revival sires not really consist, according to all the best accounts, in a great increase of demand for commodities so much as in a restoration of confidence between dealers-that is to say, sellers have again begun to believe that

they can safely give credit to buyers,

have begun to show the caution which is one of the most marked characteris tics of men who mean to pay what they premise. The speculative class, who were heavily encumbered with the debr s of the good old times before the panic, and who really furnished the strong st element to the inflationist The Washington Post thus discourses agitation, have been almost entirely ruined and have disapprared from the markets. Inflation now would come too late to save them. Even two years ago a good many of them were still struggling and clamoring for relief, but few if any now survive. In short, in the figurative slang of the street. "we have touched bottom," or rather "we have been walking on the bottom for some time." So that those whose rise will now begin, and whose opinions about financial matters will be most powerful during the next ten years, are either steady-going persons who have, through their prudence, avoided shipwreck during the last ten years, or beginners who start with the lessons of disa-ter fresh in their minds. 
