Drinking establishments and hells of infamy he knew abounded there, but the presence of the average Congressman was like a pestil-nce to the Capi-

tal. As a matter of fact the vice of drunkenness has declined among Congressmen, and as a sequence other vices have decreased. Corruption does exist. but the time has long gone by when the representatives of the people kept body servants for the main purpose of carrying them home from debauches in the small hours of the morning, or waiting about the Capitol doors to guide them home after the sessions of Congress. As in the Congress so in the British Parijament, and so, undoub edly, in all bodies of legislative repres sentatives. Dinokenness is not so common as it was a quarter of a century ago, and men are more mor l, i not less avaricious or selfish. The majornty of men who go to either House of Congress, to matter what opinion may be en'ertained of their ability or this statement is true of preceding Congresses as of this. Immediately suceeeding the war, so many bad elements were in the ascendency that crime of sickinds was noticeably increased and Congressmen, as other men, disgraced politics and hursanity many times by their excesses. But it was mairly in thed rection of thieving that men betrayed their weak natures. Personal aggrandizement, rather than the gratification of the alcoholic appetite, marked the majority of those who disgraced Washington by their presence. In days gone by Congressmen went to Wasuington more for enjoyment than at the present time, and when there went into the social vortex that is always attrac- on application. tive. Now they are interested in carrying measures, investigating others and planning for reselections. The country is grown so large and the eligible candidates for office so numerous that a Congressman finds it no easy matter to give any time to society, and busy men are rarely inclined to drink. If Washington is a worse place when Congress is in session, it is because of the presence in that city of the many hangers.


